What happened last year at NEXUS I?

More than 330 participants from more than 20 countries gathered in March 2007 at an unprecedented, sold-out collaboration of practitioners, business and community leaders, social entrepreneurs, students, and activists. Synergies were formed and social networks established through conversations, collective sense-making and resource sharing.

How will NEXUS II be different from NEXUS I?

We learned much from our first gathering last year. Feedback has led to a group of people committing to help make NEXUS II better with: 1) more intensive focus on tools and techniques, 2) more exposure to thought leaders and founders, and 3) more structured activities blended with open space opportunities. While most conferences offer a set of slated topics in a menu format, this conference is an integrated experience that will encourage participants to experiment, connect, pursue interests and advance ideas. Will I have a chance to meet some of the thought leaders and founders attending?

These approaches are broadly referred to as large-group methods/interventions, whole-system change, or large-scale change. They embody two key principles: high involvement and a systemic approach to improvement.
